Conceptualization and Treatment of Children and Youth Who Have Sexual Behavior Problems

The overall goal of the presentation is to provide participants with information regarding sexual behavior problems in children and youth who are between the ages of 3 and 17 years of age. First, information will be provided regarding normal sexual development in children and youth. Next, the presenter will provide definitions of problematic sexual behaviors and conceptualization of preschool age through adolescent age youth with sexual behavior problems. The final section of the presentation will be focused on assessment and treatment of children and adolescent youth with sexual behavior problems.

Natalie H. Wilcox, Ph.D.

Dr. Wilcox is a Licensed Psychologist at the Children's Advocacy Services of Greater St. Louis (CASGSL), providing individual, family, and group therapy to children, adolescents and their non-offending caregivers, who have been victims of child maltreatment. Dr. Wilcox received her doctorate in Counseling Psychology from the University of Missouri Kansas City and completed her APA-approved pre-doctoral internship at the Family Service and Guidance Center in Topeka Kansas. Dr. Wilcox joined CASGSL following completion of the APA-approved post-doctoral training program at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center with an emphasis in child maltreatment. During her fellowship, Dr. Wilcox received specialized training in Parent-Child Interaction Therapy (PCIT), an empirically supported treatment for children with severe behavior disorders and extensive experiential training on a manualized approach to assessment and treatment of school age children with sexual behavior problems. She also graduated from the Interdisciplinary Training Program at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center that provides specialized training in child maltreatment issues to advanced students in psychology, medicine, social work, law, dentistry, and physical/occupational therapy. Dr. Wilcox's clinical and research interests include assessment and treatment of children and adolescent victims of child maltreatment, treatment of children with sexual behavior problems, behavior and emotional problems resulting from exposure to domestic violence, and attachment issues related to the experience of child maltreatment.
